Evaluating the Accessibility and Inclusiveness of Sudbury Playgrounds for Children with Physical Disabilities

The International Classification of Functioning, Disability and Health (ICF) defines participation as “involvement in a life situation” (United Nations 2008). Playgrounds are important spaces in the daily lives of children due to the amount of time that children spend on them and the physical, intellectual and social skills that are learned. Although play is a crucial life situation for all children, often the policy and physical environments that shape playgrounds exclude children with disabilities. Thirty-four elementary school playgrounds in Sudbury Ontario were audited using a modified version of the Ontario Parks Association playability tool. The findings indicate that there are significant barriers in terms of the quantity, quality and diversity of types of play spaces available to children with physical disabilities. The findings depict playgrounds as precarious spaces for the protection of the participation and spatial rights of children with disabilities. Addressing the policy and physical environments of school playgrounds has important implications for the health of children with physical disabilities and their families and their communities. Schools are important learning environments, where, in addition to academics, children learn and are exposed to attitudes and opinions concerning bodily differences. An inclusive school environment must include school playgrounds.

Nicole Yantzi is an Assistant Professor of Geography at Laurentian University. She is also a faculty investigator with CRaNHR and program faculty with the School of Rural and Northern Health. Her Ph.D. (2005) was supported by a doctoral award from the Canadian Institutes of Health Research and the Hospital for Sick Children Foundation. Before coming to Laurentian in 2007, she held post-doctoral fellowships with the CIHR strategic research and training initiative in Health Care, Technology and Place (University of Toronto) and the Department of Population Health Sciences (Hospital for Sick Children). Her research which intersects the sub-disciplines of the geographies of health, disability and children is published in *Social Science and Medicine*, *Health and Social Care in the Community* and *Gender, Place and Culture*. As part of this ongoing research program Dr. Yantzi is working with staff at the City of Greater Sudbury and the Sudbury Children’s Treatment Centre to develop and build more inclusive playgrounds in Sudbury, Ontario.
